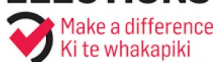

Go to your doctor or Hurst and Taylor Pharmacy in Stoke - Flu Vaccination is free there if you are; Māori, Pacifica, from a refugee background, over 65 yrs old, pregnant or whānau of someone who is pregnant or has a baby under 6 months, have certain medical conditions or are whānau of a child with a chronic condition; or, you have a chronic mental illness. If you would like your younger Tamariki vaccinated, speak with a nurse at your doctors.
